
TOP TEN REASONS TO JOIN 4-H

Cloverbuds:

Ages 5-8

The Cloverbud Club covers a broad range of topics to meet the interests of the club members. It's a great way to introduce new 4-H'ers and their families to 4-H.

Chesapeake 4-H Livestock Club:

Ages 9-18

Youth learn about caring for, raising and showing a market animal (hog, lamb, steer or goat). Youth attend monthly meetings to learn



about their livestock projects and they show what they have learned each year at the annual Chesapeake 4-H Livestock Club Show and Sale.

Chesapeake 4-H Horse & Pony Club:

Ages 9-18



Horsemanship and equine education. Focuses on bringing instruction and information to youth interested in horses. Some of the members participate in state, district and southern regional 4-H horse shows, riding Western and English. You do

not have to own a horse to participate in this club.
