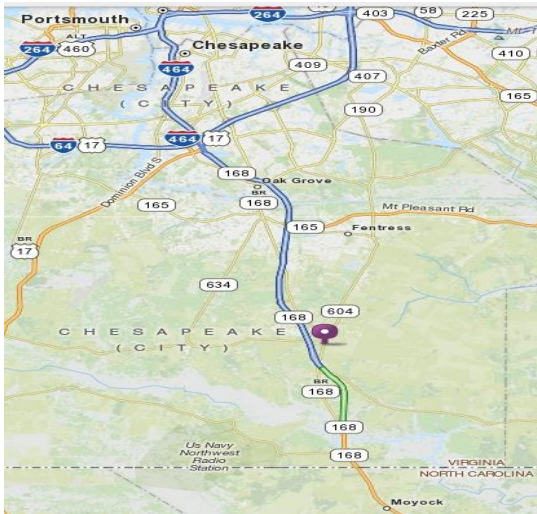


Directions To Hickory Ruritan Club Building

From I-64, take exit 291B onto 168 Bypass headed south towards Great Bridge/Nags Head. Go approximately 8 miles until you exit 168 Bypass at #8B Hillcrest Pkwy. East. Continue on Hillcrest Pkwy. East 1 mile until you reach the stop light at Battlefield Boulevard intersection. Make a right at light and travel south on Battlefield Blvd. South for 2 ¼ miles. Hickory Ruritan Club building will be on the right (just past Little Earl's Convenience Store).

From North Carolina state line near Moyock, take 168 Bypass North into Virginia to the 2nd stoplight intersection. Turn left onto Battlefield Boulevard and travel approximately 4 miles north. Look for Hickory Ruritan Club building on your left (white cinderblock building), just before Little Earl's Convenience Store.
