#### Directions To Hickory Ruritan Club Building

<u>From I-64</u>, take exit 291B onto 168 Bypass headed south towards Great Bridge/Nags Head. Go approximately 8 miles until you exit 168 Bypass at #8B Hillcrest Pkwy. East. Continue on Hillcrest Pkwy. East 1 mile until you reach the stop light at Battlefield Boulevard intersection. Make a right at light and travel south on Battlefield Blvd. South for 2 ¼ miles. Hickory Ruritan Club building will be on the right (just past Little Earl's Convenience Store).

From North Carolina state line near Moyock, take 168 Bypass North into Virginia to the 2<sup>nd</sup> stoplight intersection. Turn left onto Battlefield Boulevard and travel approximately 4 miles north. Look for Hickory Ruritan Club building on your left (white cinderblock building), just before Little Earl's Convenience Store.
